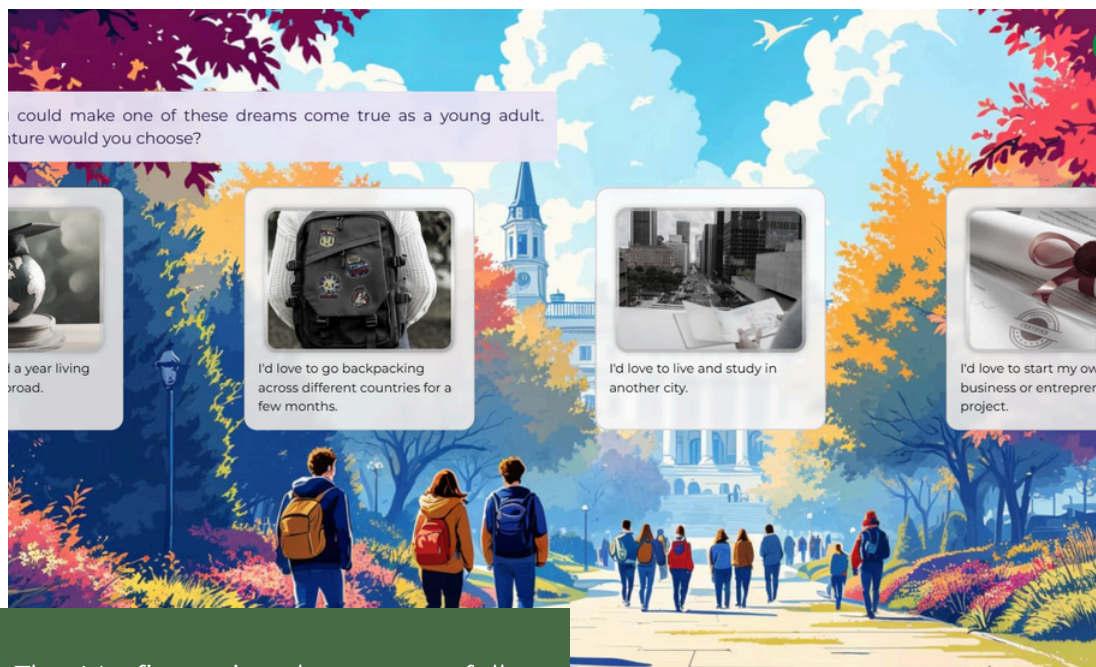

**Methodological guide**
